Thanks for contacting the WBA.

I'm happy to answer your question.

When there is a tie, there is a roll-off. For example, if you tie for most wins and most Bunco's, you are included in both roll-offs. If you win the roll-off for most wins, you get the prize, and if you win the roll-off for the most Bunco's you win that prize as well. What you have to remember is Bunco is a game of luck. Sometimes players are luckier than others on a particular Bunco night.

What is traveling Bunco? My group has been playing for two years now and we play the very basic Bunco game. There are so many different ways to play Bunco.

Dear Bonnie,
Some groups play with a traveling Bunco and others do not. It just depends on how you started out originally. Traveling adds a little spice to the game. The boxed game of Bunco "It's Bunco Time" comes with a big fuzzy die. The fuzzy die is positioned at the "head" table at the start of the game. As Bunco's are rolled, the fuzzy die is passed from player to player. If you roll a Bunco you get the fuzzy die tossed to you and so forth. The player at the end of the game holding the fuzzy die wins a prize. Groups use a variety of items for the traveling Bunco. The fuzzy die is the traditional traveler. Hope this helps answer your question.

RECIPES

Sunrise Smoothie

Serves 4

Ingredients

1/2 cup orange juice (not concentrated)

1/2 cup non-fat plain yogurt

1 banana

1/2 cup black raspberries (frozen)

1/2 cup mango (frozen)

1/2 cup strawberries (frozen)

Directions

- 1. Pour in orange juice and add yogurt
- 2. Add in fruit and blend for 2 minutes (until smooth) in blender.



Must-Have Mini Macs

Makes 48

Ingredients

1/2 pound elbow macaroni

1 1/2 tablespoons unsalted butter, (plus more for brushing)

1/4 cup freshly grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

3/4 cup milk

4 ounces cheddar cheese, shredded (1 packed cup)

4 ounces deli-sliced American cheese, chopped

1 large egg yolk

1/2 teaspoon smoked Spanish paprika

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 425. Bring a large saucepan of salted water to a boil over high heat. Add the macaroni and boil until al dente, about 5 minutes. Drain, shaking off the excess water.
- 2. Brush four 12 cup nonstick mini muffin tins with butter. Sprinkle with 2 tablespoons of the grated Parmigiano-Reggiano; tap out excess.
- 3. In a large saucepan, melt the 1 1/2 tablespoons of butter. Whisk in the flour over moderate heat; continue whisking for 2 min. Whisk in the milk and cook, whisking until the mixture comes to a boil, about 5 min. add the cheddar and American cheeses and whisk until they are smoothly melted. Take the saucepan off the heat and whisk in the egg yolk and paprika. Fold in the cooked and drained macaroni.
- 4. Spoon slightly rounded tablespoons of the macaroni and cheese mixture into the prepared muffin cups, packing them gently. Sprinkle the remaining 2 tablespoons of grated Parmigian-Reggiano evenly over tops.
- 5. Bake in the upper and middle thirds of the oven for about 10 min, until golden and sizzling. Let cool for 5 min. Use a small spoon to carefully loosen the mini macs and transfer to a large serving platter.

Fall Fruitcake

Serves 12

Ingredients

1 cup chopped golden raisins

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 1/2 cups chopped walnuts

1 cup chopped cranberries

1 cup unsweetened crushed pineapple

1/4 cup grated lemon peel

1 cup flaked coconut

1/3 cup orange juice



- 8 packets artificial sweetener
- 1 teaspoon ground mace
- 1 teaspoon ground allspice
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

Directions

- 1. Mix sugar substitute with orange juice. Pour over chopped cranberries. Soak 1 hour, mixing often.
- 2. Mix raisins, nuts, coconut, and lemon rind in flour until well coated. Add cranberries and orange juice mixture. Sprinkle baking soda over mixture, and mix. Mix in spices. Fold in crushed pineapple. Pour batter into a greased and floured 9 inch loaf pan.
- 3. Bake at 325 degrees F (165 degrees C) for 40 minutes. Cool.
